





#### WAKULLA COUNTY SHELTER PLAN

ARPC assisted Wakulla County to secure a grant for a county-wide shelter analysis project, including a final Shelter Plan for the county. The Emergency Planning team has been actively meeting with officials in Wakulla County, and are in the process of verifying buildings in the county that meet sheltering criteria, verifying actual shelter space, and producing materials for special needs and vulnerable population outreach. The project is continuing to progress, and aims to be completed by the end of Fall of 2024.
